



Thank you for reaching out to CanceRx, for an online expert opinion for assessing your treatment options.

Your case summary has been reviewed by a liver specialist, of repute, whose credentials have shared at the end of the report.

We have asked the following questions on your behalf.

What is recommended line of treatment?

The oncology opinion is summarized as follows:

As per the attached reports, there are multiple lesions in the liver. The imaging funding suggests that lesions are cancerous. Biopsy of the lesion, which is gold standard, suggests that the tumour is papillary adenocarcinoma, which is metastatic tumour from a different primary. The confounding finding is the raised alpha-fetoprotein(AFP), which is high in the setting of the primary cancer of the liver.

The Recommendation would be as follows:

1. The patient should get the benefit of a second opinion for the liver biopsy and confirm the nature of the cancer.
2. We should get some blood tests like CBC, LFT, KFT, RFT and PT/INR. These tests will give us clarity on the liver function and guide us on the treatment that can be planned.
3. If the treatment is metastatic adenocarcinoma then the patient will need chemotherapy.
4. If it is a primary liver cancer and the rest of the liver is normal in function and volume then we can check on the feasibility of respecting the tumour.
5. If the rest of the liver is not normal, then there may be a role if doing a liver transplant and other adjuvant treatments like TARE(Trans arterial radio embolization), TARE(Trans arterial Chemoembolization) and SBRT.
